

This brief ppt explains the contents of Unit 4 and shows how it links with previous units

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
This very short presentation is designed to help teachers to understand the contents of Unit 4 and to consider which new behaviours they might introduce to their students.



• Unit 1 summary

- Click #1 Unit 1 looked at the 2 key models of Learning Power – the Supple Learning Mind and the Teachers' Palette (The warp and Weft of learning)
- Although classroom culture is introduced here, the main focus in Unit 1 was on the Supple Learning Mind, how the 12 learning behaviours grow, and . . .
- Click #2 creating Learning Profiles for our students.

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Unit 2 Summary

- Click #1 Unit 2 explored 3 aspects of classroom culture (Relating, Talking and Celebrating) . . .
- Click #2 through the lens of the 4 foundational learning behaviours (Perseverance, Questioning, Collaborating, Revising)



- Unit 3 summary
- Click #1 explored the 4th aspect of classroom culture, how we construct lessons with learning in mind
- Click #2 again through the lens of the 4 key behaviours.
- The last 6 months or so have had a dual focus on Classroom Culture through the lens of the big 4 behaviours.

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- Unit 4 offers an introduction to the 8 learning behaviours that were considered in Learning Profiles, but have taken a back seat to the big 4 over the past few months.
- Each of the 8 sections are 'Toes in the Water' sections

 brief introductions to each of the 8, sufficient to get you going, but insufficient to dive in deeply (the deep dive is what Phase 2 is all about).
- Consider just one of the 8 in this case, Noticing . . .



- Click #1 each starts with a brief description / reminder of the behaviour
- Click #2 offers hints about the types of classroom cultures that nurture the behaviour
- There are . . .
- Click #3 Ideas to make students aware of the behaviour (some for younger students, some for older)
- Click #4 Ways to talk about the behaviour
- Click #5 lesson starter ideas
- Click #6 a visible thinking routine
- Click #7 an activity to develop Noticing
- Click #8 ways of reflecting on Noticing
